STUDENT COUNCIL

The Head Boy and Head Girl along with the House Captains and House Vice-Captains, Sports Captains, Sports Vice-Captains from each of the four houses are members of the student Council. It provides students an opportunity to develop leadership qualities and realize for themselves the values and importance of democratic principles through their own hands-on management of student affairs at the school.

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

1. Students must come to school wearing the complete school uniform. Regular uniform must be worn on **Mondays, Wednesday, Fridays and Saturdays** across all classes.
2. The House colour Sports uniform will be worn on **Tuesdays**. Blue uniform (Track Suit) will be worn on **Thursdays**.
3. Uniform is compulsory on all open days and when students represent the school at external events
4. Uniform must be washed, cleaned and neatly ironed. Shirts need to be tucked in neatly. Students must wear the school ID card every day without fail. If the ID card is lost or broken students must get a new one immediately.
5. Nails to be pared and clean. Personal cleanliness, hygiene and neatness is expected at all times. Shoes must be neat and clean. The shoes prescribed by the school only to be worn.
6. Girls must use black head band for short hair. Shoulder length hair can be tied into two ponies with a black band and two plaits with black band for long hair.
7. Boys must compulsorily drop their hair and absolutely no fashion cut allowed. No use of hair gel and no spikes allowed, Hair must be neatly combed; fancy hairstyles/ haircuts and colored hair will not be permitted.
8. To ensure simplicity and uniformity among students wearing bindi, jewellery, kajal, long earrings, mehendi, nail polish, kada and other accessories to school is not permitted. A pair of simple earrings, preferably studs (only for girls), may be worn to school.
9. **Improper uniform will attract a fine of Rs. 50/-**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

ACADEMIC TERM AND ASSESSMENTS FOR PRE-PRIMARY

The academic session is divided into two terms. Term I begins from June and ends with the Dussehra Vacation and Term II begins from after the Dussehra vacation and ends in March with Final Examination/Assessments.

The Assessment- 1 and Mid-Term Assessment will be conducted in the First Term. Assessment-II and Final Term Assessment will be conducted towards the end of Term II. Parents are expected to follow and instruct their child - all the information regarding the time table, portions and revisions will be given 15 days in advance.

Students absent from the examinations will not be re-evaluated except in the case of verified medical condition or approved letter. Teachers are not required to set exams for students who are absent without sectioned leave.

Revision will be conducted prior to 5 working days before the commencement of the Assessment-I and II and 10 working days prior to the mid-term and final assessment as scheduled.

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

Children must come to school wearing the complete school uniform. Regular uniform must be worn on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays.

Red Uniform (Track Suit) will be worn on Wednesdays. Uniform is compulsory on all Open Days.

Uniform sweaters will be provided and the same should be worn whenever necessary.

Uniform must be washed, cleaned and neatly ironed. Shirts need to be tucked in neatly. Students must wear the school ID card every day without fail. If the ID card is lost or broken ensure you get a new one immediately.

Nails to be pared and clean. Personal cleanliness, hygiene and neatness is expected at all times.

Girls must use black head band for short hair. Shoulder length hair can be tied into two ponies with a black band and two plaits with black band for long hair. Boys must compulsorily trim their hair and absolutely no fashion cut. Hair must be neatly combed; fancy hairstyles/ haircuts and coloured hair will not be permitted.

To ensure simplicity and uniformity among students wearing bindi, jewellery, kajal, long earrings, mehendi, nail polish, kada, kappa and other accessories to school is not permitted. A pair of simple earrings, preferably studs (only for girls), may be worn to school.

STUDY MATERIALS

1. All the school books must be neatly binded, labelled with the student's name, class, section and subject mentioned.
2. It must be neatly maintained throughout the year.
3. Childern are not permitted to tare, paste stickers and colour the pages of school notebooks unless specifically instructed by the teachers.
4. All the Nursery and LKG Childern need not bring pencils, eraser and sharpener to the class, the respective class teachers will provide the same.
5. UKG childern must carry a simple pencil-box with a sharpener, pencils, eraser and a ruler.
6. Home assignments will be given fortnight. It has to be completed and submitted on or before the date mentioned.
7. The classwork and homework books should not be used for any rough work.

CONDUCT

All childern are required to behave with courtesy at all times, confirm to the norms of good conduct.

English is the spoken language in the campus. Everyone in the campus must speak in English.

1. Being a co-educational institution, appropriate behaviour and healthy friendship is expected between childern.
2. No childern and parents are to be found wandering around the ICSE school campus and the PUC, Degree college campus.
3. Childern actions and language should be courteous at all times.
4. Serious action will be taken on those who fail to treat others (childern and staff) with respect.
5. Childern indulged in any other act or behaviour such as theft, fraud, deceit aiding in copying during exams, misuse of school premises etc, that bring disrepute to the school strict actions will be taken.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline is about teaching children appropriate behavior and helping them become independent and responsible people. The purpose of discipline is to encourage moral, physical, and intellectual development and a sense of responsibility in children.

1. Children must greet, respect and obey their teachers and school authorities at all times.
2. All school leaders must be given due respect.
3. Hauling, running, playing and shouting in the classrooms and corridors are prohibited.
4. While going to the Assembly, PT, Dance, Music classes and during Break Time the students must go in silence, in a single line without disturbing the neighbouring classes.
5. Children are expected not to carry any money to the school.
6. If any student has a medical problem, the same must be brought to the notice of the class teacher/nurse in writing on the day the school re-opens.
7. If any student are not toilet trained kindly send them with diapers until they are trained.
8. In case the child wets his/her dress the spare dress which will be provided by the school, should be washed, ironed neatly and returned on the following day.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The school is committed to safeguarding and protecting the right of children in its care, including their right to be protected from the harmful influences abuse and exploitation. We ensure compliances of the Child Safeguarding and Protection Policy through orientations and seminars being conducted in the school for the children, staff and the supporting staff in the school.

It is obligatory for parents, guardians, teachers, and helping staff to report incidents of physical or psychological violence, aggression, harassment, immediately or within the next school day to the academic co-ordinators /school counsellors who, in turn, shall inform the principal immediately. Students are encouraged to report incidents for which they themselves or others may be the victim.

As per this policy, there is a Child Protection Committee to act on any complaint received. The Committee comprised 3 staff members one from each section of the School, Primary, Middle and Secondary.

LOST AND FOUND ITEMS

Children need to take complete responsibility for their belongings in school and on all trips. All materials carried by the children must be clearly labelled with the child's full name and class.

Everyday items such as water bottles, lunch boxes, stationeries, shoes and clothes are deposited in the open storage on the ground floor. Children who have lost them need to look for their lost items in this area after the school hours with the help of the person in charge of lost and found.

SCHOOL E-MAGAZINE

The school publishes an E-Magazine, titled, “**THE ASSISIANS**”, twice in a year – in October and March. It aims at opening up new vistas of creative engagement among the students showcasing their achievements, literary skills, and talents.

The magazine will also include the events and programs being organized during the period as mentioned above. Motivational and authentic articles and write-ups about the school life and activities from the students will be accepted and published in the E-Magazine.

ACADEMIC TERM AND EXAMINATION

1. The academic session is divided into two terms. Term I begin from June and ends with the Dasara Vacation and term II begin from after the Dasara vacation and ends in March with final examination. The school holds Four Formative Assessments (FAs) and two Summative Assessments (SAs) in an academic session for Classes I to X.
2. The Summative Assessment is conducted towards the end of each term. Parents are expected to follow and instruct their child/children.
3. Students who are absent for the Assessments for any reason other than sickness (to be justified by a doctor's certificate) will be considered as absent.
4. No Assessment will be held before or after the scheduled dates of the examination. No re-examination will be conducted in case of students absenting themselves from any examination or test.
5. Serious misconduct or malpractice in an examination disqualifies a child for the whole examination.
6. Activities may be re-conducted on medical reasons. Permission for the same to be obtained from the Principal by submitting a valid medical certificate.
7. Any clarification/information/message required by parents from teachers must be noted in the parent communication page provided in the handbook.
8. Parents are requested to sign messages, portions, timetables given in the handbook, Progress Reports, or any other similar documents when required. **FAILURE TO DO THIS MAY CAUSE SIGNIFICANT INCONVENIENCE TO THE CHILDREN AND RESULT IN THEM BEING SENT HOME.**
9. Internal marks will be calculated based on the oral, written activities, completion and neatness of the CW.
- 10. PRIVATE TUTIONS ARE NOT ENCOURAGED. NO TUTION IS PERMITTED FROM THE TEACHER WHO TEACHES THE PUPIL'S OWN CLASS.**

OPEN DAY

1. 8.30 am to 12. 00 noon (dates as scheduled in the handbook)
2. The Open Day will be conducted after each Formative Assessment and Summative Assessment 1. Parents can view and check the answer sheets of their child/children on the Open Days.
3. Time slots for the parents to attend the Open Day will be communicated to the students three days prior to all the Open Days. This is to ensure that parents have the equal opportunity to discuss their child's progress with the teachers within the given time. Parents must strictly follow the given time to attend the Open Day.
4. It is compulsory for the parents to attend all the Open Days. The school maintains a report of the attendance of parents on the open day. **Parents who miss the open days are requested to note that the marks of their ward will not be uploaded on the website.**
5. Parents are encouraged to share their feedback, concerns, suggestions, or grievances, if any, by writing them in the Open Day Record Book. The book will be available in each classroom during the Open Day. Please remember to include your child's name, class, and section for reference. Parents are requested to ensure that the name, class and division of the students are mentioned in all letters addressed to the school.
6. The school expects parents to attend Orientations, Open Day Meetings and school functions as per the schedule communicated to them, and thus show their interest in their child's school activities.

ATTENDANCE

1. Regular classroom attendance is essential for developing successful life skills including self-discipline, responsibility and punctuality. It is important that parents promote the view that regular attendance and timeliness are important to ensure the best possible learning outcomes. Irregularity and frequent absenteeism lead to disconnect in children's learning.
2. Regular attendance and punctuality are keys to a students' academic success; no matter what the age of the learner. Parents must ensure that their children are punctual to school unless the children are sick.
3. Students are not granted leave outside the regular vacation periods. Parents are not entitled to take children for holidays during school days. Leave of absence must be applied for in advance only when they are convinced of its absolute necessity.
4. Leave taken for less than 3days should be intimated through the Handbook. Leave taken more than 3days should be inform through a leave letter.

5. Students who are suffering from contagious diseases should not be sent to school. Sick leave should be accompanied by a medical certificate from the doctor who is treating.
6. Those who are falling sick during school hours will be taken care of by the school and parents will be informed of the sickness, so that they can take the children home for further treatment.
7. On the re-opening day of the school and after every long holiday like Dasara and Christmas, attendance is compulsory. **Failure to provide prior notice for absence will lead to disciplinary action and a fine of Rs. 50/-.** It is mandatory for the students to have 80 % of attendance for the promotion to the next class, failing which the results will be withheld.

STUDENTS' ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

1. Parents must ensure that their children arrive at and leave school punctually. Students arriving late to school miss out on the opportunity to start their day in a relaxed and comfortable manner.
2. Students should aim to be inside the school building by 8. 15 a.m. The first bell for the school assembly is rung at 8.25 am. Strict action will be taken against habitual latecomers. The school entrance doors will be closed at 8.25 am.
3. Students found to have come late for more than five days in a month will not be allowed to attend classes and on continued occurrence, disciplinary action shall be taken against them.
4. Students must leave the school campus once they come out of the school building. They are not expected to wander about or gather together on the ground without the consent of the teachers.

STUDY MATERIALS

1. All the school books must be neatly bind, labelled with the student's name, class, section and subject.
2. It must be neatly maintained throughout the year.
3. Books must be brought according to the days' time-table without fail.
4. Students are not permitted to tear, paste stickers and colour the pages of school notebooks unless specifically instructed by the teachers.
5. Carry a simple pencil-box with a sharpener, pencils, pens, eraser and a ruler.
6. Random bag check will be followed and if students are found carrying any extra books which is not according to the time-table, the books will be taken and not returned.
7. **The school will not be responsible for books, gold ornaments, money, clothes and other articles that are lost**

GENERAL CONDUCT

1. There is one fundamental school rule, which is that all students at all times will behave well and sensibly and show courtesy, consideration and respect for others, and do nothing that will bring the school's name into disrepute.
2. All school rules apply to all students from the time they leave home for school until they have returned home at the end of the school day, or while taking part in any activity organized by, or related to the school.
3. All school rules apply to students when they are travelling on the school bus. Continued disorderly conduct shall be sufficient reason for refusing school bus service to a student.
4. The school reserves the right to make changes in the school rules and regulations which will be communicated to students and parents.
5. All students are required to behave courtesy at all times, conform to the norms of good conduct and respond readily and carefully to requests concerning good order and discipline that may be made from time to time by the teachers and school management.
6. All students are expected to contribute to a positive learning atmosphere in the class by co-operating with the teacher, getting work done on time, contributing to discussions, asking questions and avoiding distractions in the class.
7. Students are not permitted to loiter outside classrooms or laboratories. When using staircases and corridors, students are requested to keep to the left.
8. English is the spoken language in the campus. Everyone in the campus is expected to follow this rule. **A fine of Rs. 50/- will be charge if student speak in any other language.**
9. Being a co-educational institution, appropriate behaviour and healthy friendship is expected between students.
10. Any unhealthy relationship found in the campus will be dealt strictly.
11. No student is to be found wandering around the ICSE School, PUC, Degree College premises in the campus.
12. Students' actions and language should be courteous at all times. Students must not indulge in fights (physically or verbally) with other students in the campus. Stringent action will be taken against the students instigating in such acts.
13. Serious action will be taken on those who fail to treat others (students and staff) with respect, including any communication written, personal contact, e-mail, social media, use of threatening language etc.
14. Students indulged in any other act or behaviour such as theft, fraud, misuse of school premises etc, that bring disrepute to the school will be suspended.
15. All unresolved disagreements amongst peers must be brought to the class teacher's notice.

STUDENT - DISCIPLINE

1. Students must greet, respect and obey their teachers and school authorities at all times.
2. All school and House leaders must be given due respect.
3. Hauling, running, playing and shouting in the classrooms and corridors are prohibited.
4. No student should enter any classroom other than his/her and any other floors without the permission from the teachers.
5. While going for the Assembly, Library, Computer Lab, PT, Dance, Music classes and Lunch Break students must go in silence, in a single line without disturbing the neighbouring classes.
6. Students must remain in their respective classroom during the Short Break to have their snacks.
7. Alternate days for boys and girls will be assigned for them to go down for their Lunch Break.
8. No carrying money to school unnecessarily.
9. No student is allowed to visit the canteen for the short break or lunch break. A plausible letter is to be given by the parents and only after the approval of the principal a lunch token will be issued from the office.
10. Due to various reasons separate entry and exit for the boys and girls are arranged.
11. Students are not allowed to use the washroom during class time, unless required. Such needs must be attended to during the break.
12. If any student has a medical problem, the same must be brought to the notice of the class teacher/nurse in writing on the day the school re-opens.

NO PLASTIC IN SCHOOL

1. To ensure the campus is a “Plastic Free Zone”, plastic is strictly prohibited in the school campus.
2. Students are not supposed to bring any kind of plastic bottles or plastic tiffin box.
3. Students can bring a steel/copper water bottle.
4. Students can bring the snacks or lunch in a steel tiffin box and not in any kind of wrappers of snacks.

5. NO JUNK FOOD ALLOWED

SCHOOL PROPERTY

1. Each individual student should take pride in keeping the school campus clean and green.
2. Students must take care of the school property. No scratching, writings or drawings should be done on the school furniture or walls.
3. Damage done by accident must be reported to the class teacher. Students who willfully damage school property will have to face the consequences.
4. In addition, those who cause the damage will be liable to repair the same at their own expense or required to be made good in identical replacement.

STUDENT BIRTHDAY

1. The school recognizes that birthdays are special for students. On birthdays, the school greets, prays and sing the birthday song for the children who celebrate their birthdays.
2. Parents are requested not to send chocolates, or candies with children for valid reasons. Parents are requested not to send any gifts for any staff member of the school. On their birthday, students may wear cloths of their choice that conform to norms of modesty.
3. The birthday student can contribute a story book or motivational book (not mandatory) to the library with his/her name and the date mentioned. It will be a memory and a birthday gift for the entire school.
4. Certain days on the school calendar are designated ‘non-uniform ‘days. On such days, students may wear color dress provided that it meets the standards and expectations of the school and community.
5. On non-uniform days, students are required to dress appropriately and follow the guidelines set by the school. Bare shoulder, short dresses, distressed clothing, are not acceptable in the school.

MOBILE AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

1. Students are not allowed to bring to school any electronic gadgets, mobiles and accessories. Any electronic devises (including wearables) found on a student in the school will be confiscated for a period of one year.
2. There may be cases, when parents expect children to contact them after the school. In such cases, mobile is allowed with written request from the parents and permission from the principal under condition that the mobile is handed over to the School Office at the time of entry to the school and collect them on their way out.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

1. The school is committed to safeguarding and protecting the right of children in its care, including their right to be protected from the harmful influences abuse and exploitation. We ensure compliances of the Child Safeguarding and Protection Policy through orientations and seminars being conducted in the school for the children, staff and the supporting staff in the school.
2. It is obligatory for parents, guardians, teachers, and helping staff to report incidents of physical or psychological violence, aggression, harassment, immediately or within the next school day to the academic co-ordinators/school counselor who, in turn, shall inform the principal immediately. Students are encouraged to report incidents for which they themselves or others may be the victim.

SOCIAL SERVICE PROGRAMME

1. A key feature of St. Francis High School is providing and enduring learning experience to instill the values of caring, compassion, and empathy in students. These values lie at the heart of the SFHS service-learning activity and equip students with the knowledge and skills to bring about positive change. In this regard, the school had initiated the Social Service Programme, called MISSION SFHS to reach out to the less privileged children in the periphery,
2. The MISSION endeavours to establish a community of parents, students and well-wishers willing to share their blessings and resources with the less privileged children especially who are in the periphery of life.
3. The objective of the MISSION is to develop a sense of social responsibility and a feeling of empathy for others among the children. With the motto “ONE CHILD FOR ONE CHILD,” we aim to create a community of children who care, share, and encourage other kids who live in poverty and deprived of the basic necessities of human life.

SCHOOL E-MAGAZINE

The school publishes an E-Magazine, titled, “**TARANG**”, aims at opening up new vistas of creative engagement among the students showcasing their achievements, literary skills, and talents. The Magazine will also include the events and programs being organized by the school during the academic year.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special Educator provides the right grounding for children with learning difficulties or challenges and keep them anchored during their foundational years at school. It aims to facilitate growth, enhance learning and empower educators to meet the needs of children who learn differently.

SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION FACILITY

1. St. Francis High School provides transportation facilities for students. They have to register their names with all the details of bus route, bus number, boarding point, etc. at the office, before the academic year begins.
2. Making use of the bus service is not compulsory, but **once registered for transportation service, parents will have to pay full year’s fee even if they desire to discontinue after a month.**
3. In case the parent / guardian wishes to change the boarding point or bus route, a written application should be submitted to the office in advance.
4. On the identity card of Pre-Primary Students, the boarding points and the bus number in which they are travelling should be written very clearly.
5. If any student causes any damage to the bus he/she will be levied fine and may be banned from using the school transportation service.
6. Bus fees may be increased as and when the Management finds it essential.
7. Bus fees will be charged for all the 12 months of the academic year.
8. Without prior notice, a bus service, or any bus stop will be cancelled if the Management decides to do so.

INFORMATION ON SCHOOL FEES

School fees and transportation fees can be paid in four installments as per the schedule given below:

The total annual fees can be paid in the first term itself.

- Online transactions are chargeable.

Offline payment :

- Fees (either by cash or cheque) will Not be collected in the school office.
- Fees can be paid by cash / cheque at the bank.
- Fees are to be paid through Bank challan only. The Challan has to be collected from the School office. Pay the fees at **THE SOUTH INDIAN BANK**, in our Campus, 3rd Block, 8th Main, Koramangala, by way of cash or Demand Draft favouring “**St. FRANCIS HIGH SCHOOL**” as per the bank timings. [10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on weekdays and from 10:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. on Saturdays]. The bank will be closed on second Saturdays and fourth Saturdays.
- Collect the challan from the school office on the dates specified (i.e., from 1st to 15th of every term) between 10 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. and pay the fees through this challan at South Indian Bank, School campus branch.
- Collect the student copy of challan from the Bank with Bank’s seal /signature.
- Receipts for the fees paid can be obtained from the school office after 15th of every term by producing the student copy of the challan collected from the bank.

Please Note: After the due dates mentioned above, a fine of ₹ 10/- for tuition fees and transport fees per day will be charged and the defaulters will have to pay the fees along with the fine.

SCHOOL WEBSITE

1. It will be appreciated if parents regularly check the school website for the updates/ information regarding the events. (Pictures of the events will be uploaded in the gallery)
2. Information regarding Timetable /Portions for exam/circulars can be viewed on the school website www.stfrancishighschoolsslc.com under the common notification and class notification

Login credentials, such as the user-name (admission number) will be given, password will be the registered mobile number of the parent.

SCHOOL MOBILE APP

Parents should download the school mobile app from the playstore by searching for St Francis High School Koramangala with the school logo to get the daily report on portions covered/ homework etc. The marks card of the examination held will be uploaded in the app under Student Report/Marks Card. School Fees/school bus fees also can be paid through the fee module.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

1. New students will be admitted after a written and oral test and on payment of the first two installments of fees. The amount thus paid will not be refunded even if the student for any reason should leave the school after the admission within the academic year.
2. Two month's notice (before January ends) is to be given before the withdrawal of a pupil. Such notice is to be given by the person responsible for the student. A student who desires to discontinue studies should take the Transfer Certificate immediately.
3. No transfer certificate will be granted until the school dues are fully paid.
4. Children who absent themselves for more than 10 consecutive working days without prior permission will have their name struck from the school roll.

DISMISSAL

1. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience or defiance of authority, lack of sufficient efforts to improve in studies, conduct against the moral tone of the school and parental non-cooperation with the staff or school authorities are sufficient reasons for dismissal of a student.
2. A student involved in any incident even outside the school which brings discredit to the institution either because of unpleasant nature or inviting criminal or legal action by police or by the court will be dismissed from the school without further inquiry.
3. The school reserves the right to dismiss the student whose conduct is harmful and who is also damaging the physical and moral well being of other students and of the school or whose parents show little interest in the progress of their wards.

ULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES :

1. Before answering the questions enter your roll number, standard, division, subject and date correctly.
2. Pay close attention to any general instruction provided at the beginning of the question paper.
3. Remember that neatness, handwriting and spelling will be taken into account in every subject.
4. Read the questions very carefully for five minutes. A great deal of time is wasted in writing down information that is not wanted and no marks are given for it.
5. Any misprint/incomplete question due to printing lapses must be reported to the invigilator immediately.
6. Write on both sides of the paper and number the pages.
7. Number your answer as per the question paper.
8. Revise your answer papers before submitting them. Students very often fail to check their answers which results in loss of marks.
9. No pupil is allowed to have any book or notes in their possession inside the examination hall. Anyone caught cheating will be immediately expelled & reported.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Books are issued to the pupils weekly on the day fixed for each class. They must be returned within the prescribed time. A fine of Rs. 2/- per day will be charged thereafter.
2. On receiving a book, pupils are requested to examine it and report any damage if noticed; otherwise, they will be held responsible for the damage.
3. If any damage is noticed by the Librarian on return of a book, the pupil returning it will be charged for the damage. Books lost by any pupil, must be replaced or the cost paid for.
4. Pupils are not allowed to exchange or lend books among themselves or to outsiders. Defaulters will be severely dealt with.
5. The library record card should be duly filled in and the librarian's initials obtained.

WEEKLY HOMEWORK SCHEDULE FOR CLASSES I TO X

1. The weekly homework as scheduled for Classes I to X by the subject teachers of respective classes are intended to be carried out by the students during non-school hours. The students are expected to attend the homework regularly.
2. The homework as mentioned doesn't cover all the teaching subjects especially in the lower classes, however, the students must be self responsible in reading and revising the day's lesson regularly even if homework is not given/asked for the day.
3. Parents must ensure that the students follow the schedule for the homework without fail and do the task before reporting to the school on the next day or as directed by the subject teacher.
4. Parents must monitor the child/children and ensure that the children complete their homework, revise the lesson, engage themselves in improving their writing and reading skills on a regular basis.
5. Please ensure that your child cultivates the habit of reading her/his lessons daily at home. Every child must revise the lesson taught in the class every day and not only engaging himself / herself in completing the homework and activities at home. This will help her/him to easily understand the lesson and also remember it well.
